COME HOME TO THE LORD

CHOOSE HIM JOIN HIM REJOICE WITH HIM

We invite you to “Come Home to the Lord” in 2026. To do this we want to continue the pattern of **choosing Him** daily, **joining Him** in His work of salvation and exaltation, and **rejoicing with Him** as we experience the blessings of the gospel. In 2026, we emphasize the important role that your **home** and the **temple** play in that process.

YOUR HOME

“Only the home can compare with the temple in sacredness.” (Bible Dictionary). Like the temple, your home can become a refuge from the world. This occurs when we “yield to the enticings of the Holy Spirit” (Mosiah 3:19) and choose to have daily experiences with the Lord, personally and as a family. We invite you to commit to join the Lord in His work in your home by:

- Living the Gospel of Jesus Christ - diligently learn, live, and teach the gospel in your home.
- Caring for Those in Need - minister to others in their homes and allow others to do the same for you.
- Invite All to Receive the Gospel - with the Lord’s Spirit in your home, it becomes a place where you can share the gospel with those not currently living with its blessings.

You can come home to the Lord as you invite His Spirit into your home daily and allow His work to occur there. (see Revelation 3:20, D&C 88:119, Hymn #1020 Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling).

THE TEMPLE

“The temple is literally a house of the Lord.” (Bible Dictionary). The Lord invites us to come home to Him in the temple as we strive to live His gospel and unite families for eternity. President Russell M. Nelson taught us that nothing will bless us more than the time we spend in the temple. We invite all youth and adult members to choose to work with their local church leaders to obtain a temple recommend, and then to worship there, joining the Lord in His work as often as your circumstances permit. (see Psalm 27:4)

PROMISED BLESSINGS

As representatives of Jesus Christ, we promise that coming home to the Lord in our homes and in the temple will be a tremendous blessing. The Holy Spirit will teach each of us how to apply this vision to our individual lives, and as we act on those promptings, we will experience greater peace and happiness. We will have increased opportunities to rejoice with the Lord and with each other. (see Luke 15:6)

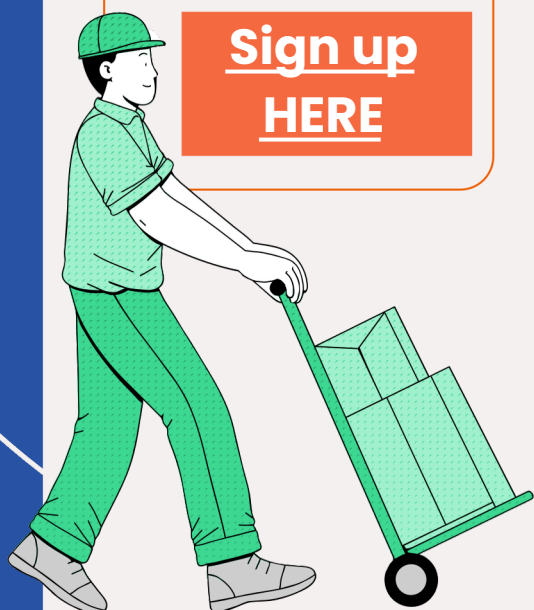

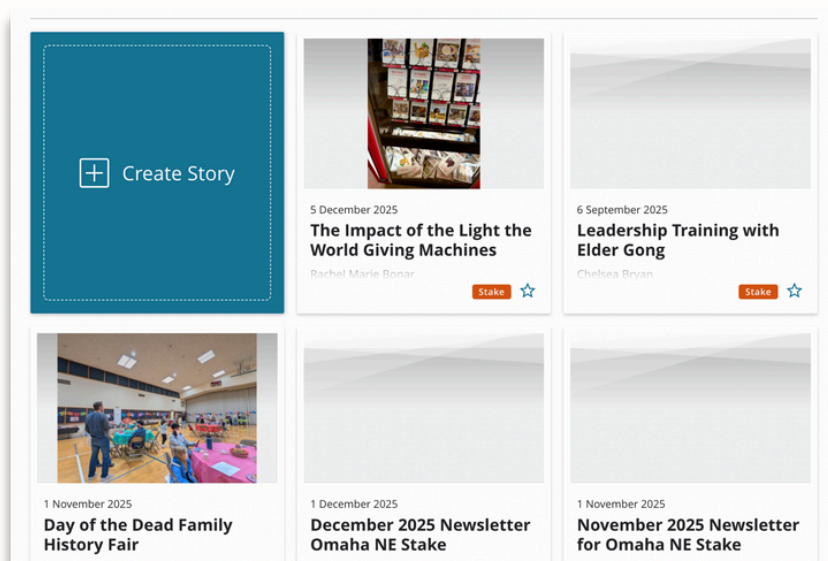

teaching MOMENTS

Whether you are called to teach at church, teaching at home, assigned to speak in church, or sharing with others, becoming an effective Gospel teacher enriches and elevates those around you. The purpose of "all gospel learning and teaching is to deepen our conversion and help us become more like Jesus Christ. For this reason, when we study the gospel, we're not just looking for new information; we want to become a 'new creature' (2 Corinthians 5:17). This means relying on Heavenly Father and Jesus Christ to help us change our hearts, our views, our actions, and our very natures." {Come Follow Me 2026}

As you prepare for your teaching opportunities this year, consider efforts to help you better know and better love those you teach. The late Elder Jeffrey R. Holland, described by many as a powerful Gospel teacher, once said: "You can start by loving God. Then you can ask Him to help you extend your love for Him to others who need your love." Relatedly, Elder Holland said "the first great truth of all eternity is that God loves us with all of His heart, might, mind, and strength. That love is the foundation stone of eternity, and it should be the foundation stone of our daily life. Indeed it is only with that reassurance burning in our soul that we can have the confidence to keep trying to improve, keep seeking forgiveness for our sins, and keep extending that grace to our neighbor." Perhaps your love of God and those you teach will also encourage them to keep trying, to keep going, and to "deepen [their] conversion" to Him in everlasting ways.

Finally, Elder Holland taught "If [students] are unresponsive, maybe you can't teach them yet, but you can love them. And if you love them today, maybe you can teach them tomorrow. . . . I think that is totally within our power. None of that is dependent upon them. We can love them from start to finish, and miracles will happen."

The Winter Quarters temple was dedicated on April 22, 2001. This coming April, we will be commemorating the 25th anniversary of this dedication. With this in mind, I invite you to consider these two questions:

- What does the Winter Quarters Temple mean to you?
- What can you do between now and April to make the temple more meaningful in your life?

This might look different for different people, and we are not limited to a singular means of creating meaning. Ideas include:

- Teaching your children or other family members about the temple,
- Making the temple a regular destination,
- Obtaining, renewing, or using your temple recommend, and
- Engaging in family history work and identifying the names of deceased relatives for whom you can perform ordinances in the holy temple.

In the Book of Mosiah, we read about the teaching of Alma to “as many as would hear his word” after he fled from the servants of King Noah.

In Mosiah 18:30, we read:

“And now it came to pass that all this was done in Mormon, yea, by the waters of Mormon, in the forest that was near the waters of Mormon; yea, the place of Mormon, the waters of Mormon, the forest of Mormon, how beautiful are they to the eyes of them who there came to the knowledge of their Redeemer; yea, and how blessed are they, for they shall sing to his praise forever.”

In the Winter Quarters Temple we have the opportunity to receive covenants through sacred ordinances. Temple ordinances allow others to receive baptism – just like those at the Waters of Mormon – to become clean, and to likewise receive additional covenants.

I invite you to prayerfully consider what you might do to make the Winter Quarters Temple a meaningful place, just like the Waters of Mormon were to the people of Alma. Perhaps the Holy Ghost has already whispered to you what you should do. As we follow promptings and seek to more faithfully worship in the temple, we may feel to rejoice and say:

“The temple of Winter Quarters, how beautiful it is to the eyes of us who there came to the knowledge of our Redeemer!”

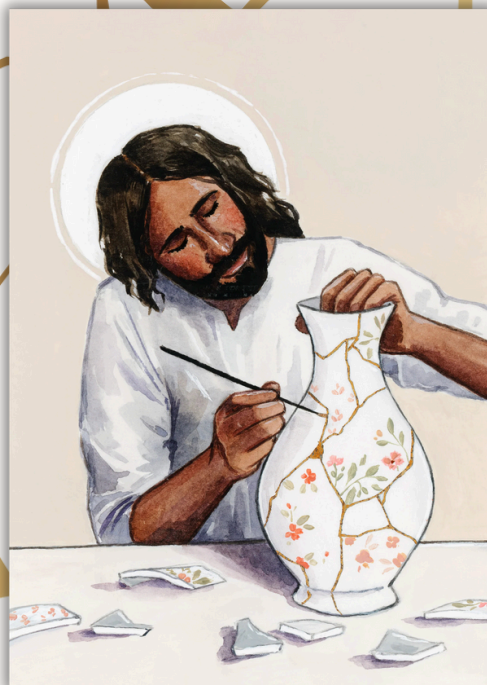

SETTING GOALS & MAKING A PLAN



Why Plan for Emergencies?

The start of a new year is a great time to set goals—including emergency preparedness. Natural disasters, power outages, and personal crises can happen at any time. Having a solid family emergency plan helps you react calmly and confidently.

Three Steps to Create a Family Emergency Plan

1. Identify Key Information
2. Write down critical details, including:
 - Emergency Contacts: Family members, close friends, and an out-of-state contact in case local phone lines fail.
 - Meeting Places: One near home (for fires) and one outside your neighborhood (for large-scale emergencies).
 - Evacuation & Shelter-in-Place Plan: Know where to go if you must leave home or if staying inside is safer.
 - Communication Plan: If separated, how will you reconnect? Text messages often work when calls fail.
3. Involve Your Family
 - A plan is only useful if everyone knows it. Discuss different emergency scenarios with your household.
 - Practice emergency drills so everyone knows what to do. Make it fun—time how quickly family members can grab their 72-hour kits and shoes!

Preparedness Tip of the Month: Write down your family emergency plan and review it together. Keep a copy on the fridge and in your emergency kits.

Family Challenge: Complete a Family Emergency Plan Worksheet (free templates available at Ready.gov or the Red Cross).
