Everyone Can Do Something, But No One Has to Do Everything

"I feel so bad," my father-inlaw told me about a month ago. "I haven't researched any names to take to the temple. I really need to get started and do it."

I was surprised. My father-inlaw is turning 91 years old this year. His eyesight is so poor that he struggles to read his iPhone, even on the largest font settings. Plus, he takes care of my mother-in-law fulltime, as she deals with memory problems. Learning how to do family history on FamilySearch might be the last thing I'd ask him to do.

"Dad," I said with a smile,
"anyone can research your
ancestors. But you are the
ONLY person on earth who has
special memories of some of
them. That would be a
priceless way for you to do
family history. Will you tell me
a story about them that I can
record?"

Brothers and sisters, there are great blessings and power available to us when we try to find, connect with, and be sealed to our ancestors. But we don't need to feel guilty about how we do it. Instead, we should seek inspiration to decide which family history activities to do.

In a 1989 Ensign article, Elder Dallin H. Oaks said, "Members of this church have many individual circumstances...We should understand that in the work of redeeming the dead,there are many tasks to be performed, and that all members should participate by prayerfully selecting those ways that fit their personal

circumstances at a particular time. This should be done under the influence of the Spirit of the Lord....Our effort is not to compel everyone to do everything, but to encourage everyone to do something."

Full-time missionaries don't just knock on every single door in town. They pray for inspiration about where to go, whom to work with, and how to find the people Heavenly Father has prepared for them. In the same way, I encourage you to ask your Heavenly Father for guidance about what your temple and family history activities and goals should be right now.

Should it be finding a name to take to the temple, gathering family memories and pictures, learning stories about your ancestors, resolving "record hints" in the FamilySearch app, inviting another member to attend the temple with you, doing indexing activities, teaching your children about family traditions, or something else? Check out the "Activities" tab on FamilySearch or the "Activities" tab on thefhguide.com for lists of ideas for ways your family can engage in temple and family history work.

But most importantly, be prayerful, and ask for guidance on how you can help unite families for eternity. The Spirit will guide you as you move forward in faith, and you will feel the warm influence of God in your life as you help bring souls to Him.

We currently have MANY open appointments.


Please consider donating blood and/or a little time to assure this drive is a success. Donating a pint of blood is a "small and simple" act, but for those in need, it can literally be a life saver!
