




MISSIONARY MOMENT

STAKE TEMPLE & FAMILY HISTORY MESSAGE

A wonderful Temple and Family History devotional was held on January 23, with messages shared by President and Sister Calaway (Nebraska Omaha Mission), President and Sister Pincock (Winter Quarters Temple), and Elder Rodney A. Ames (Area Seventy North America). Elder Ames shared three invitations:

- 1.Do what God has written on your heart.
- 2. Hold regular Temple and Family History Coordination Meetings.
- 3. Worship in the temple at your level of sacrifice.

Let's explore each of these further:

- 1.) As we have recently learned in our Come, Follow Me study, God has a work for each of us to do in the ongoing Restoration of the Savior's gospel. As we seek the Lord's will, we will be prompted and guided to act.
- 2.) Elder Ames' second invitation is for the ward temple and family history leader, assigned members of the Relief Society and elders quorum presidencies, an assistant in the priests quorum, a presidency member of the oldest Young Women class, and temple and family history consultants. These individuals meet and counsel together to:
- Coordinate efforts to implement the ward temple and family history plan.
- Plan how to help specific ward members prepare to receive temple ordinances.
- Plan how to help specific ward members with their temple and family history work. (See General Handbook 25.2.7)

3.) Each member determines when and how often to worship in the temple. Review the temple schedule. Prayerfully consider what would be an appropriate level of sacrifice. President Russell M. Nelson counseled:

"Please schedule regular time to worship and serve in the temple. Every minute of that time will bless you and your family in ways nothing else can. Take time to ponder what you hear and feel when you are there. Ask the Lord to teach you how to open the heavens to bless your life and the lives of those you love and serve. ... I promise that as you increase your time in temple and family history work, you will increase and improve your ability to hear Him."
